"Southeast... A Bridge to the World."



One of the four recipients of this year's Alumni Merit Awards is Sigma Tau Gamma alumni, John Brussman. Brussman graduated from Southeast Missouri State University in 1957 with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology. He also attended the microbiological institute at Furdue University in 1960 and

studied plant physiology at Southern Illinois University in 1964. Prior to his retirement. Brussman served as a board member and as vice president and general manager of Busch Agricultural Resources, Inc., a subsidiary of Anheuser-Busch Companies.


Brussman began his career at Anheuser-Busch Companies, Inc., as a laboratory technician in 1957, and worked in various positions with the company until his retirement. Brussman also served in the U.S. Army. He participates in a number of civic organizations, including Boy Scouts of America, Rotary Club and the Jaycees. John and his wife Martha recently moved to Reno Nevada.

John and Martha were this years host for the Sigma Tau Gamma reunion/vacation held every two years. The reunion is made up of Sig Tau's and their wives and widows from the 50's and 60's. ## "GRAND CHAPTER"

This past August, members of Alpha Phi attended the 41st Grand Chapter in Kansas City. Grand Chapter is the supreme governing and legislative body of Sigma Tau Gamma Fraternity. The Grand Chapter has the authority to legislate for the good of the Fraternity and to adopt and amend the Constitution and Laws. It meets biennially, and consists of delegates from collegiate and alumni chapters, alumni associations, the Board of Directors, Past Presidents and Society of Seventeen. Alpha Phi was recognized at the conference, both individually and as a group for achievements they have accomplished in the past year.

First award Alpha Phi received was the Earl A. Webb Most Improved Chapter Award. It is presented to the chapter that makes the greatest improvement over the previous academic year in membership recruitment, management, member education and programs.

Our Second award of the night was the E. Kennedy Whitesitt Communications Award. It is presented to the chapter judged to have the best alumni newsletter and website.

Our final and biggest award of the night was won by our current President. Ryan Glodo was awarded the Ellisworth C. Dent "Man of the Year" Award. The award was established in 1966 to honor the most outstanding undergraduate leaders in Sigma Tau Gamma. Selection for the award is based on leadership, extracurricular activities and scholarship and scholastic service to both his university and chapter. This is the first le in the history of Alpha Phi that someone from the Chapter has taken home this award.
