




NEW LOCATION, SAME TRADITIONS





SIG TAU NAMED NEW ARMY GUARD CHIEF

LT. Gen. Clyde A. Vaughn, Alpha Phi '68 has been named as the next national chief of the Army National Guard in the Pentagon.

Last April the Senate confirmed his nomination as director of the Army National Guard - and his promotion to the three-star rank of lieutenant general.

In 1974, Vaughn got his commission as a second lieutenant through the Missouri Guard's officer candidate school. He spent the next 10 years serving with Missouri Guard engineer units in Dexter, Sikeston, Charleston and Cape Girardeau.



In 1985, Vaughn went on active duty and built up expertise in South and Central America, serving in Ecuador and Panama. Vaughn was promoted to brigadier general in the summer of 2000. Since November 2003, he has been the assistant on National Guard matters to Air Force Gen. Richard Myers, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Aside from many different deployments, Vaughn, Jr., also had the unforgettable experience of witnessing the third airborne attack on September 11, 2001 when, from approximately a half-mile away, he saw the plane slam into the side of the Pentagon.



As a teenager at Dexter High School, Vaughn played fullback on the football team. When he moved on to Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, he switched to cornerback and became a member of Sigma Tau Gamma Fraternity.

After getting a bachelor's degree in education from Southeast in 1968, Vaughn returned to Dexter High School, where he taught history and coached football.

Vaughn completed the United States Army Command and General Staff College in 1989 and in 1994 received a MPA from Shippensburg University.

Vaughn's father, a World War II veteran, retired from the National Guard in 1981 as a Chief Warrant Officer. And the general's son - Chad Vaughn, 31 - is a captain in the Marine Corps and flies F-18 Hornet fighters.
